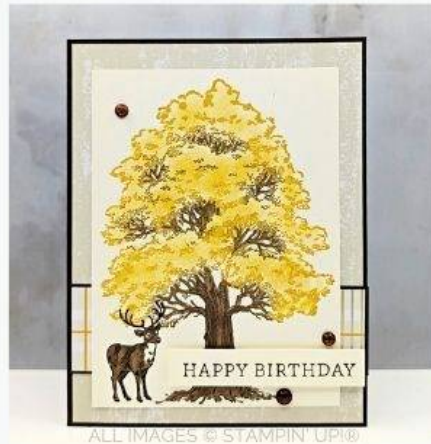
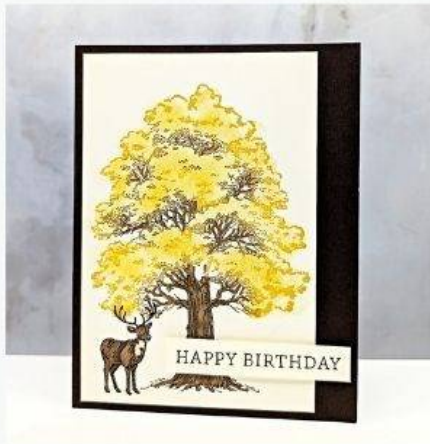

- Early Espresso Cardstock (119686; \$14)
- Very Vanilla Cardstock (166784; \$14)
- Early Espresso Ink Pad (147114; \$9)
- Crushed Curry Ink Pad (147087; \$9)
- Daffodil Delight Ink Pad (147094; \$9)
- Medium Deep Stampin' Blends (159461; \$11)
- Sponge Daubers (133773; \$7.50)
- Streaked Dots (165902; \$9)
- Stampin' Cut & Emboss Machine (149653; \$130)
- Paper Trimmer (152392; \$28)

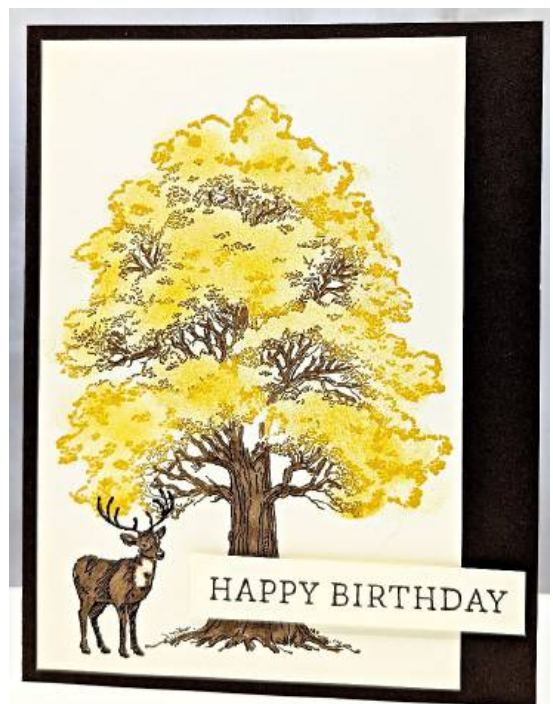
Busy Bee Card

Measurements:

- Early Espresso Cardstock: 5-1/2" x 8-1/2", scored at 4-1/4"
- Very Vanilla Cardstock: 4" x 5-1/4"
- Very Vanilla Cardstock: 3-1/2" x 5-1/4"
- Very Vanilla Cardstock: 1/2" x 2-3/4"

Busy Bee Card Instructions

- 1) Fold the Early Espresso Cardstock in half at the scoreline to create your card base. Adhere the 4" x 5-1/4" piece of Very Vanilla Cardstock inside the card base.
- 2) Ink up the top (canopy) of the tree image using Crushed Curry ink. Add Early Espresso ink to the "wood" part (branches, trunk, etc) of the image using a Sponge Dauber and the Early Espresso ink pad. "Huff" on the stamp to remoisten the ink and stamp onto the 3-1/2" x 5-1/4" piece of Very Vanilla Cardstock.
- 3) Stamp the deer image to the left of the tree using the Early Espresso ink pad. Using a clean Sponge Dauber, sponge the tree canopy with Crushed Curry ink, filling in white space. Use the Medium Deep Blends to color in tree trunk & deer. Adhere to the front of the card as shown in sample.
- 4) Stamp the sentiment from the *Simply Said Stamp Set* onto the 1/2" strip of Very Vanilla cardstock using Early Espresso ink. Adhere to card front using Stampin' Dimensionals to finish.



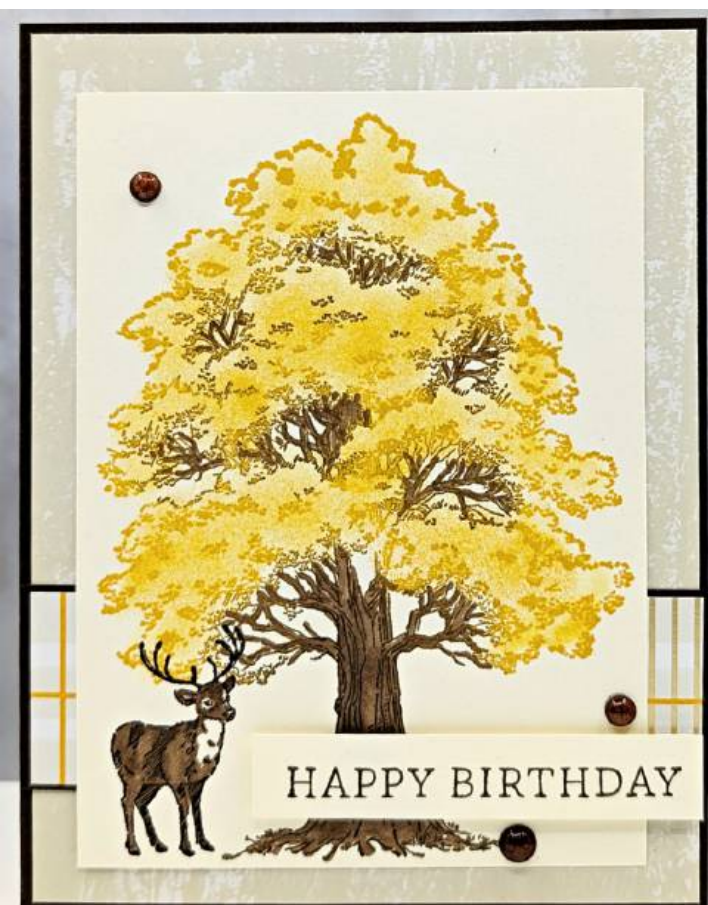
Worker Bee Card

Measurements:

- Early Espresso Cardstock: 5-1/2" x 8-1/2", scored at 4-1/4"
- Very Vanilla Cardstock: 4" x 5-1/4"
- Gathering Together Designer Paper (Basic Beige Pattern): 4" x 5-1/4"
- Gathering Together Designer Paper (Gold Foil Striped Pattern): 1" x 4"
- Early Espresso Cardstock: 1-1/4" x 4-1/4"
- Very Vanilla Cardstock: 3-1/2" x 4-3/4"
- Very Vanilla Cardstock: 1/2" x 2-3/4"

Worker Bee Card Instructions

- 1) Fold the Early Espresso Cardstock in half at the scoreline to create your card base. Adhere the 4" x 5-1/4" piece of Very Vanilla Cardstock inside the card base.
- 2) Adhere the 4" x 5-1/4" piece of Gathering Together Paper to the front of the card. Adhere the 1" strip of Gathering Together Paper to the 1-1/4" strip of Early Espresso cardstock; adhere to front of card, about 3/4" up from bottom of card.
- 3) Ink up the top (canopy) of the tree image using Crushed Curry ink. Add Early Espresso ink to the "wood" part (branches, trunk, etc) of the image using a Sponge Dauber and the Early Espresso ink pad. "Huff" on the stamp to remoisten the ink; stamp onto the 3-1/2" x 4-3/4" piece of Very Vanilla Cardstock.
- 4) Stamp the deer image to the left of the tree using the Early Espresso ink pad. Using a clean Sponge Dauber, sponge the tree canopy with Crushed Curry ink, filling in white space. Use the Medium Deep Blends to color in tree trunk and deer. Adhere to the front of the card as shown in sample.
- 5) Stamp the sentiment from the *Simply Said Stamp Set* onto the 1/2" strip of Very Vanilla cardstock using Early Espresso ink. Adhere to the card front using Stamping Dimensionals.
- 6) To finish, add 3 of the Streaked Dots as desired to the front of the card.



Queen Bee Card

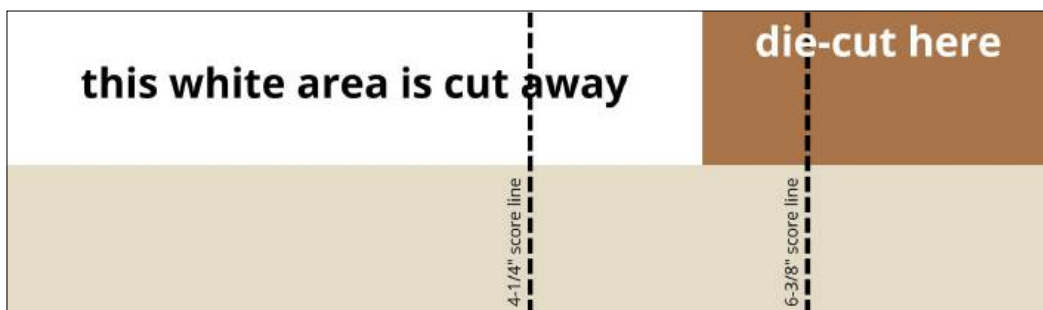
Measurements:

- Early Espresso Cardstock: 5-1/2" x 8-1/2", scored at 2-1/8" and 4-1/4"
- Gathering Moments Designer Paper (Basic Beige Pattern):
 - 4" x 5-1/4"
 - 2" x 5-1/4" (2 pieces)
- Gathering Moments Designer Paper (Gold Foil Striped Pattern):
 - 1" x 4-1/8"
 - 1" x 2" (2 pieces)
- Early Espresso Cardstock: 2-1/2" x 8-1/2", scored at 4-1/4" and 6-3/8"
- Early Espresso Cardstock: 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" scrap (for die-cutting)
- Very Vanilla Cardstock: 5-1/2" x 8-1/2" (for die-cutting)



Queen Bee Card Instructions

- 1) Fold the 5-1/2" x 8-1/2" Early Espresso cardstock as a Mountain Fold at the 2-1/8" score line and as a Valley Fold at the 4-1/4" score line.
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- 2) Adhere the two 2" x 5-1/4" pieces of Basic Beige Gathering Moments Paper to the left and middle flap on the card front. Adhere the 4" x 5-1/4" piece of Basic Beige Gathering Moments Paper to the "inside" (or right side) of the card front.
 - 3) Using the 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" Early Espresso Cardstock, fold into a Mountain fold at the 4-1/4" score line and a Valley Fold at the 6-3/8" score line. *(Tip: this should be the opposite folds from the card base.)*
 - 4) Using the 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" scrap of Early Espresso cardstock, die-cut the small silhouette bush image. Set aside.
 - 5) Using the long die that has the deer, tree, etc., line up the die so that the 6-3/8" score line is between the 2 deer and the large deer's ears are at the very top of the cardstock. *(I taped the die down with Washi Tape to make sure it didn't move while die-cutting. Some of your die will be "off" the cardstock on the right side.)*
 - 6) Run through the Cut & Emboss Machine. Using your scissors or Trimmer, cut from the first bush (to the left of the small deer) to the left edge of the cardstock so that the width of the cardstock is 1-1/4" high. Adhere the bush die-cut from Step #4 to the back of the "bush/stone" image on the right.



- 7) Glue the right side (valley fold) to the right side of your card and the on the left side, adhere glue only to the 2" on the left side where it meets the 2-1/8" Mountain Fold. Adhere the 1" pieces of the Gathering Moments paper to the Early Espresso cardstock, starting with the 4-1/8" long piece on the left side, and then the two 2" pieces on the two right panels.
- 8) Using the 5-1/2" x 8-1/2" piece of Very Vanilla cardstock, cut a 1/2" strip from the 8-1/2" side. Cut this 1/2" strip down to 2-3/4" and 3". Stamp the "let's celebrate" from the Simply Said stamp set on the 2-3/4" strip using Early Espresso ink and adhere over the deer on the "inside" card so that it sits right up against the 4-1/4" score line. See sample for placement.
- 9) Stamp the "happy birthday" on the right side of the 3" strip using Early Espresso ink and set aside.
- 10) Using the remaining piece of Very Vanilla cardstock, stamp the deer using Early Espresso ink. Color in the deer using the Medium Deep Blends. Die-cut using the Autumn Trees dies.
- 11) Ink up the top (canopy) of the tree image using Crushed Curry ink. Add Early Espresso ink to the "wood" part (branches, trunk, etc) of the image using a Sponge Dauber and the Early Espresso ink pad. "Huff" on the stamp to remoisten the ink and stamp onto remaining Very Vanilla cardstock. Sponge more Crushed Curry ink onto the canopy and color in the tree trunk using the Medium Deep Blends. Die-cut the tree using the large "open" die.
- 12) Die-cut the large "canopy leaves" die from the remaining Very Vanilla cardstock; use a clean Sponge Dauber to apply Daffodil Delight on the canopy leaves; adhere to the large die-cut tree. Adhere the tree to only the left side of the front panel (*be careful to not get any glue on the part of the tree that hangs over the 2-1/8" score line.*)
- 13) Adhere the sentiment from Step #9 onto the tree; adhere the deer to left side using adhesive.
- 14) To finish, add 3 of the Streaked Dots as desired.
